Record attendance at MDX's for Business Conference

This year's guest speaker was Virginia Deputy Secretary of Transportation Grindly Johnson. Secretary Johnson was recently a recipient of one of The Women Who Move the Nation Award from the Conference of Minority Transportation Officials, Secretary Johnson provided the small, local and minority owned companies attending the conference some insightful advice on partnering and winning contracts with the transportation industry and government in general. Secretary Johnson lauded MDX for exceeding the goals that the federal and state governments have achieved of close to 10% as compared



to the 35% to 40% that MDX has paid in service contracts to small and local businesses.

"This is another example of MDX reaching out to address the needs of our community," said MDX Chairman Louis Martinez. "Every company starts out as a small business, and providing an avenue where business can forge partnerships while learning how to holistically grow their company will benefit our local economy through the economic multiplier effect."

"What better way can we accomplish this than by having created more than 23,000 jobs over the past 20 years. "In addition to hosting this annual event geared to small and local businesses, MDX provides free certification training opportunities for local residents in our community seeking employment opportunities in transportation infrastructure construction," said Helen Cordero, MDX Manager of Procurement and Contracts Administration.
