Area Tolls Suspended to Aid Traffic After FIU Bridge Collapse

MIAMI, Fla., March 16, 2018 – MDX has temporarily suspended tolls on SR 836/Dolphin Expressway entrance and exit ramps nearest to the Florida International University pedestrian bridge collapse. MDX Chairwoman Shelly Smith Fano, in consultation with MDX Executive Director Javier Rodriguez and with approval from the MDX Board, has made the decision that the tolls at the eastbound SR 836 exit to NW 107th Avenue and the westbound SR 836 entrance from NW 107th Avenue will be suspended to facilitate movement on the local roads.

"The sheer impact of this tragedy requires the cooperation of as many Miami-Dade agency resources as can be reasonably managed," Fano said. "We are looking to lessen the impact as commuters utilize alternate routes until the debris is completely removed."

Florida's Turnpike entrance and exit ramps, as well as several blocks along SW 8th Street are closed as the collapse is investigated and the debris is removed. Drivers are encouraged to utilize SR 836 to NW 107th Avenue as an alternate route to the exit at SW 8th Street of the Florida's Turnpike without paying a toll. This toll suspension will remain in effect until SW 8th Street is reopened.
